



# Incline High School

## Booster Minutes 9.22.10

---

1. Approval of August 25<sup>th</sup> Meeting Minutes
  - a. Bill Hub motioned for approval, Emily Smith seconded
2. Financial Report: Bill Hub
  - a. No significant changes this month. Concession sales are bringing in money but at this point we are still at a deficit due to the buying of “for sale” products. We should see a positive income stream from concessions after homecoming.
3. Principal’s Report: Brenda Hadden
  - a. First newsletter of the year is being mailed this week. It is very detailed. It was asked if the newsletter would be available online. Brenda said it could be but we need to be very careful as children’s names are often in the newsletter. It is important that we are aware and not publish any children’s name on the Internet.
  - b. Infinite Campus is up and running. More later from Kathie Goldberg.
  - c. Mid terms are here. Calls will be made to parents when children are failing. They hope to make calls like this every 4 weeks.
  - d. PSAT will be given Oct. 13. Freshman and juniors will need to sign up and pay \$13. The test is mandatory for sophomores and fees will be covered by the district. National Merit Scholars are selected based on this test. The ACT now offers a similar test called “Plan”. It might be offered next year along with the PSAT. Study guides are available. It was suggested that these be passes out at enrichment classes. Online classes are available to prepare for the test. Brenda will e-mail us the resources. Brenda stressed

that these assessment tests are important but more universities are looking at the “whole child” and many other aspects of a child’s education are part of the universities evaluations.

- e. Homecoming week starts Monday September 27<sup>th</sup>. The theme is Harry Potter. Many activities are planned for the whole week with the parade and football game on Friday, Oct 1<sup>st</sup>.
  - f. The Nevada Department of Education requires that each school have a comprehensive “Discipline Plan”. Brenda and Stacey have discovered that the current Incline HS plan is not adequate. The plan is due next week. Brenda and Stacey will be providing a “framework” this year instead of a plan and are looking for parent input. This will be a “living document” this year with the goal of having a completed plan by the end of the school year.
  - g. Heath Morrison is coming to Incline Friday September 24<sup>th</sup> to speak to the faculty and staff of our k-12 campuses. He will also be holding a “brown bag lunch” meeting the first Wednesday of November at noon.
  - h. There will be a meeting for all freshman parents at 5:30 pm on Oct. 13<sup>th</sup>.
4. Athletic Director’s Report: Jan Groff with Brian Broaddus present
- a. Boy’s soccer uniforms are on order. Boy’s basketball will also be getting new uniforms.
  - b. Sharla Baker, our new cheerleading coach, had to come late to the Booster meeting because of a cheer practice. She is asking Boosters for support for uniforms. The school has not had any cheerleaders for several years. Now we have 17! This is the largest group our school has ever had. The cheer team was on the uniform rotation for last year but was skipped because the team did not exist. Sharla has pieced together uniforms for the girls but they are miss-matched. She needs about \$100 per girl for shoes, poms, under armor, briefs and sweatshirts. The team has been fundraising and has \$370 currently. They will be holding a carwash this weekend.

- c. Jan announced that the football fundraiser made \$7,000. This will be added to the \$9,000 they made last year. Kathie Goldberg asked how they would be using this money. Last month the football coach asked boosters to pay for health insurance for 6 players. Booster's mission is to provide funds which benefit the whole team not individual players.
    - d. Concession Stand and Sales:
      - i. Shelly Wright was not able to be present but wanted to thank both Jan Groff and Kathie Goldberg for all of support with concessions. Kathie said that there still is a need for volunteers to work at the snack shack.
- 5. Booster Membership and Product Sales: Kathie Goldberg
  - a. Membership sales are continuing but are still lower than last year. We are at about 100 members and last year we had 120. Kathie plans to sell memberships at youth soccer night, homecoming, has sent e-mails to past alumni who have joined. Membership forms will be sent with the newsletter which is going out this week. Kathie encouraged teachers to join. The fee is reduced for teachers and staff to \$10 annually. We are trying to sell our stock of tee-shirts and sweatshirts before ordering more but only have larges and extra larges left.
- 6. Senior Grad Night Parent Committee: Carolyn Smith
  - a. Carolyn Smith reported that the committee is on track with its planning. They are looking at planning a dinner in Reno followed by an Aces game. Then they would go to "Jump man Jump" which is a warehouse fun land with the ability to hold an overnight party. Delmonte Ranch seniors went there last year and had a great time. The committee will be presenting this idea to the senior leadership group for approval. The cost will be far less than in years past and they are planning two fundraisers. One at the Hacienda.
- 7. Crab Feed Report: Nancy Porten

- a. Date confirmed of Jan. 29<sup>th</sup> with North Tahoe Conference Center and Purple Wave. NTCC contract need approval and payment of a \$1,000 deposit by Oct. 7<sup>th</sup>. Karen Johnson voted that we approve the contract and payment. Bill Hub seconded it.
- b. Nancy Porten has contacting all of the people who worked on the auction last year and the list of people who indicated they would help on their Booster membership form. She is still waiting for responses back.
- c. Carolyn Smith and Karen Johnson said that there is a binder of information with details about how the is run. Heidi Breider may have it.
- d. A Chair for the Crab Feed is still needed
