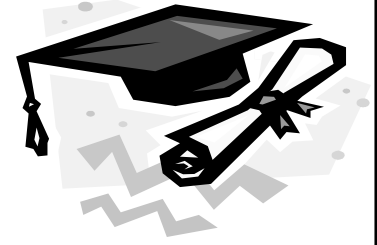

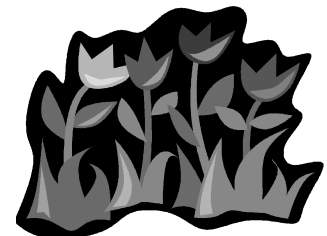

JROTC UPDATE

The school year is quickly coming to a close for Incline High School's JROTC program, but the Highlander Battalion is staying busy. Highlander Cadets have recently participated in several exciting events, and will continue to do so throughout the remainder of the school year.

On April 23rd, the Highlander Cadets participated in Washoe County Silver State Brigade Olympics. The Brigade Olympics were held at Reno High School. The Brigade Olympics was an opportunity for Highlander Cadets to compete in nine athletic events against 11 other schools in the Brigade, and the Tiger Battalion from Douglas High School. The Highlanders performed very well in the Eight Person Leg Stretch and Sit-ups, earning 4th place in each of these competitions. Also, we were in the hunt in the other events, but arrived slightly short. We are very proud of our performance though.

After the Brigade Olympics, Cadets had very little time to relax before once again becoming busy. On April 27, nine Highlander Cadets traveled to Camp Parks, California, to attend the JROTC Cadet Leadership Challenge (JCLC). JCLC was a four-day camp where Cadets from all the Army JROTCs within the Silver State Brigade and the Tiger Battalion had fun improving their leadership skills, team building, and confidence. During JCLC, all Cadet participated in five events which the Leadership Reaction Course, the Confidence Course, Rope Bridging, Rappelling, and Orienteering. At the Leadership Reaction Course, teams of six to eight Cadets attempted numerous scenarios to resolve difficult obstacles and problems working as a team. At the Confidence Course, again these same teams would difficult obstacles, working as a team, and under timed conditions. At Rope Bridge, Army Instructors taught Cadets numerous knots and rope-bridging techniques; afterwards, the Cadets constructed a one and two rope bridge across a 60-foot swamp, then they crossed the swapped appropriately. At the Rappelling, Cadets learned proper rappelling techniques on a 15-foot angled wall; afterwards, all Cadets rappelled the 55-foot vertical wall. At Orienteering Course, Cadets were paired, they were given a map and compass and three hours to locate 20 points.

The fun did not end for the Highlander Battalion when the Cadets returned from JCLC, as they prepared for further excitement in the Reno-Tahoe area. On May 14th, we participated in the Silver State Brigade Orienteering Meet at Galena Park. Over 280 Cadets from the Brigade, South Tahoe, Douglas, Carson, and Churchill County High Schools competed one two courses, novice and advanced, where the advanced had three categories; male, female and coed. The novice competitors had two hours to locate as many points possible, and the advanced competitors had three hours. Cadet First Lieutenant **Megan Lambretti** and Cadet Staff Sergeant **Bailey Stevenson** earned 5th place in the female category. Congratulations ladies!!!!

On May 16th, the Highlander Battalion conducted their 28th Annual JROTC Awards ceremony to recognize the Cadets efforts for their hard work over the past school year. The Most Prestigious is the Superior Cadet Award, given to a Cadet from each Leadership Education Training Level that demonstrated exceptional performance throughout the year. This year's winners are Cadet SSG **Angelica Lucero** (LET-1), Cadet CSM **Steven Scheid** (LET-2), Cadet CPT **Carla Mejia** (LET-3) and Cadet LTC **Nicholas Hooker** (LET-4). Congratulations to all of the Highlander Cadets for their outstanding work this year.

Greetings from the IHS Library. The end of the school year is approaching quickly, and so is our annual Barnes and Noble Fundraiser, which is on Sunday, May 22 from 1-5 PM. It is time to take care of some end-of-the-year business. All books are due in the library by May 31st. At the moment, we have over 50 overdue books still checked out. The usual charge for lost books is \$10, but some, especially non-fiction, are more. Seniors must return all books and take care of any fines before graduation.

Recently we have been busy assisting students with finding books for pleasure and their research projects. In addition to print materials, students use three databases that are available to Washoe County schools:

ABC CLIO is a social studies database widely used by our government, geography and history classes.

EBSCO is a database for general reference, periodicals, current events, and more.

GALE is an extensive database for general reference, science, world languages, magazines, periodicals, and much more.

Many students believe that everything on the internet is valid and true, so we teach and encourage them to use reputable sites and the ethical use of research materials.

Study Club meets in the library, three days a week: Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday from 2:15 to 4:15. Teachers are on duty to help students with their assignments, so please encourage your child to attend and take care of homework before going home. Study Club will continue until the week before finals.

Mandarin classes, which are held on Tuesdays, from 2:15 to 3:00 PM have been very successful and well attended. Thanks to the teachers, Candy Perrine and Nancy Wong who donate their valuable time to our students.

We had our final Book Club meeting on Monday, May 9th. Our last choice was *Revolution* by Jennifer Donnelly—a young depressed teenager is transported back to the French Revolution through a diary left behind by the companion of Louis XVI and Marie Antoinette's doomed son. The novel is well-researched historical fiction and follows the parallel lives of these two young girls as they struggle with fear, loss, death, love, and redemption. I highly recommend this one for your child's summer reading. Our group read and discussed seven novels this year, and we are so grateful to Linda Offerdahl for donating the funds that make this club possible.

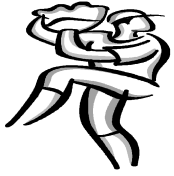

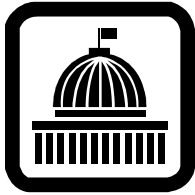
Leadership News

“We the People” A.P. Government Class

We the People Wrap-up for 2010-2011

The *We the People*/AP Government class is wrapping up a successful and busy school year---here are a few highlights. In October the class organized and facilitated a Civics Expo at Incline High School. The expo was designed to educate the Incline’s student body on the candidates and issues during the 2010 midterm election. The *We the People* class organized into two person teams and during all Enrichment classes went over the candidates and the ballot questions, preparing students for a mock national general election sponsored by the University of Virginia.

In December, Incline High School placed third out of six teams at the Nevada Congressional District 2 *We the People...the Citizen and the Constitution* competition. Twenty-one seniors performed well demonstrating their knowledge of American government and constitutionalism. The *We the People...the Citizen and the Constitution* is a civics curriculum designed to promote civic competence and responsibility among the nation’s students. During the competition in Reno the students testified on their knowledge and understanding of constitutional principles in a simulated Congressional Hearing; students were judged by members of the academic and legal communities of Nevada as well as state government officials, Congressional Staffers, and the Associate Director for the Center for Civic Education. Our students won one of six unit awards delivering the most compelling testimonies on the role of the United States in shaping the concept of the rule of law. The Incline students finished third overall to Reed High School and Reno High Schools; Reed ultimately participated in the national finals in late April.

After preparing for and completing their Advanced Placement United States Government and Politics Exam, the *We the People* students have been mentoring Janey Muccio’s 8th graders in the middle school version of the *We the People* Program preparing them for their own mock congressional hearings in June. I am proud of the WTP class of 2011 for their commitment to active and engaged citizenship.

I would like to extend a very sincere thank you to all that have supported us over the year---our class appreciates it! This truly is a school and community effort. Ms. Henderson and many other faculty and community members dedicated countless hours to this class developing content knowledge and refining presentation skills for the *We the People* competition in the fall.

Most importantly, I would like to recognize those students in the class of 2011 who demonstrated a hunger for knowledge and a commitment to each other in this rigorous endeavor. It takes great courage to work this hard and come so close. Students in the WTP class have a lot to be proud of...fine work young citizens!

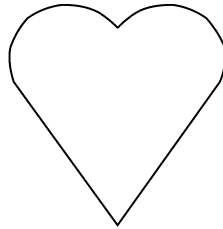

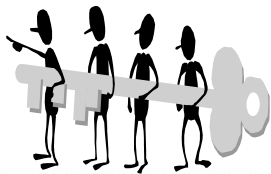
Plato Lab-Alternative Ed. Classes

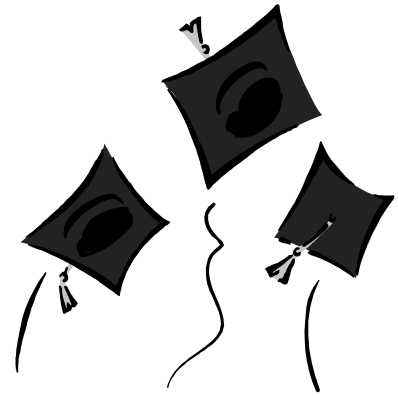
