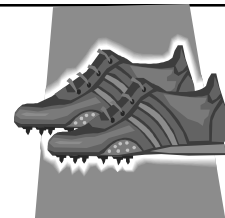

I take great pleasure in introducing myself as the new librarian at IHS. I am still teaching English half-time and continue as the English Department Leader. I am thrilled with my new position and am learning every day from Milly Corneil, our dedicated library associate. I am scheduled in the library during 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> periods. Milly is here full-time, and the library is open daily from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM.

Our library contains over 13,000 books with almost 3,300 in our fiction collection, and this year we will be focusing on adding new books in order to update our materials. Since the beginning of the year we have added to our biography, literature, history, and fiction sections. We also have two printers, a copier, a scanner, and 17 desktop computers with internet access available for student use. Our computers on wheels cart (COW) currently has 18 laptops available for class use.

Milly and I have already taken the freshmen class through orientation which included a tour of the library, students creating their own accounts on the school server, and an introduction to some of our data bases.

I'd like to thank all of you who attended our fundraiser at Barnes and Noble in May. A portion of each purchase made by our friends that day went to the library, and we received a credit card for \$470 which will help us to purchase more books.

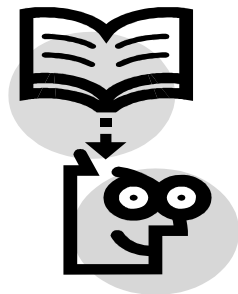

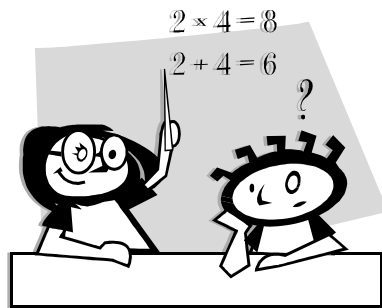

## National Honor Society News

There have been several inquiries as to how a student becomes a member of the Incline Chapter of the National Honor Society. It is an invitation membership based upon specific criteria.

First, to be eligible for membership consideration, students must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 weighted, plus 3 honors courses by the end of the first semester of their sophomore year. Additionally, potential members must meet high standards of leadership, service, and character. Leadership is based on the student's participation in two or more community or school activities, or election to an office.

To meet the service requirement, the student must have been active in three or more service projects in the school and community. Character is measured in terms of integrity, behavior, ethics, and cooperation with both students and faculty.

Finally, students are screened by a Faculty Council consisting of six members.

When a student is invited to be a member of the NHS at IHS, a formal letter will be sent in the mail, and the induction ceremony will be held in the late spring. The student either accepts or declines the invitation. Once a student accepts membership, he or she takes an oath to uphold the principals stated above. If a student declines membership, he or she will not be eligible for high school membership again.

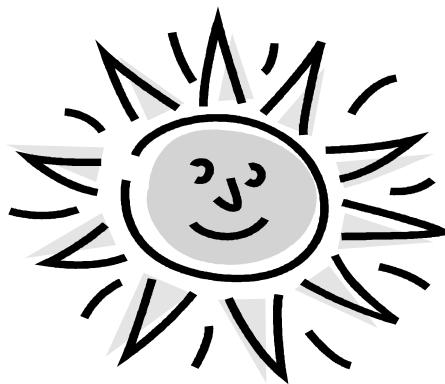
## *Leadership/Student Council Update*

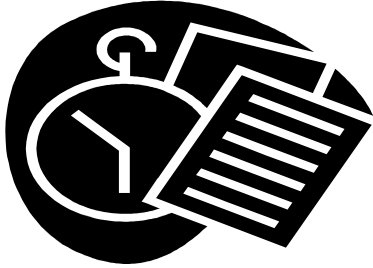

PSAT INFO

**The PSAT or Preliminary SAT/National Merit Qualifying Test (NMQT)** will be given at Incline High, on **Wednesday, October 13, 2010**. The PSAT offers a valuable opportunity to practice taking the SAT and JUNIORS taking the test are automatically entered into the National Merit Scholarship Program (NMQP). Past Incline High School parents, Karen Doughty Hunt and Cynthia McClelland, have initiated a free program to help Incline High School students achieve their after high school dreams. Next Steps began last year as a service to the IHS students to help answer some basic questions:

*Do you know what you are doing after high school?*

*Need a little help?*

*What's the plan?*

Working closely with the school counselor, Next Steps assists students in answering these questions and by working with the student to get them to where they want to be by graduation. In addition, Next Steps can help to guide a student through the maze of college planning including testing, applications and admittance or figuring out if trade school or other available choices might be the best path after high school, Next Steps lends a hand (and an ear) to aid in successfully transitioning a student's thoughts and dreams into actions and reality after high school.

*The demand has far outreached what Next Steps can do without some help. Next Steps invites you to join them in a new program that is available for IHS students in the 2010-11 school year:*

### Mentoring at IHS

Why Mentor? - A mentor is an adult who, along with teachers and parents, provides young people with support, counsel, friendship, reinforcement and constructive example. Mentors are good listeners, people who care, people who want to help young people bring out strengths that are already there.

- The mentoring program is intended to create a support system and a college-going culture that positively impacts the lives' of our Incline High School students.
- Community mentors will be trained on the mentoring process and will be invited to celebrate the success of their mentee.
- Mentors will be provided with information and resources that specifically address the goals of their mentee.
- The support structure will involve monthly communication between the mentor and the student to discuss college-going topics and to participate in events that will assist them in making their "NEXT STEPS".
- We ask Mentors to commit to 3 hours per month for 3 years—Junior, Senior, & 1<sup>st</sup> year of college or Vocational Technical training. But, whatever time you have is greatly appreciated.
- Special events such as financial aid and application workshops, college/vocation technical campus visits, student panels, and shadowing days will be provided to students (and mentors) to learn how to make attending college a reality.

### Benefits to Student:

- A caring adult mentor who is a protective factor leading to a brighter future
- Mentored youth are less likely to initiate drug and/or alcohol use
- Improve in attitude toward school.

- Make a difference in the life of a student
- Share knowledge and life experiences

### **COLLEGE AND SCHOLARSHIP TEST REQUIREMENTS**

*For selective colleges, including University of California schools, the military academies, and ROTC scholarships, students are encouraged to take both the ACT and the SAT tests. Online registration: SAT at [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com) and ACT at [www.act.org](http://www.act.org).*

### **SAT II SUBJECT Tests**

*These are one-hour tests given in sets of three. Subject areas include literature, math, sciences, social studies, and foreign languages. These tests are required by the University of California system and certain selective colleges. Check requirements of individual schools as soon as possible.*

### **TEST DEADLINES**

*College bound students are recommended to take ACT and SAT at the end of their junior year and/or at the beginning of their senior year.*

*Scholarship and selective college applicants must take ACT/SAT by November of their senior year (better yet, think October).*

*University of Nevada Reno scholarship applicants must take the ACT by December of their senior year.*

### **COLLEGE APPLICATIONS**

*Because the college application process can be a lengthy one requiring essays, resumes, letters of recommendation, transcripts, etc., students should plan on a minimum of two weeks to complete each application packet. Most colleges and universities require that applications be submitted on line. See individual college and university websites for application information and requirements for individual institutions.*

### **APPLICATION DEADLINES**

*University of California application filing period is November 1-30. Consult college catalogues/website for all other deadlines. Some college deadlines are as early as October!*

*UNR application deadline is March 1. Scholarship application deadline is February 1.*

### **COLLEGE FAIR**

*Reno's College Fair for students and parents is usually held in the fall. Representatives from over one hundred colleges will be available to answer questions. Watch for announcement of exact date, time, and place.*
